Junior League of Orange County, CA (JLOCC) is a volunteer organization of over 300 women committed to advancing women's leadership skills to impact our community. Since its inception in 1956, JLOCC has supported Orange County by infusing hope and catalyzing change within numerous community organizations through volunteerism and advocacy.



JLOCC is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that has contributed over \$7.5 million and countless volunteer hours toward the establishment, and in support of, many Orange County organizations for 68 years. Some of the most prominent and effective institutions in Orange County were started by JLOCC, including the Newport Bureau of Volunteerism (OneOC), New Directions for Women, Orangewood Children's Home (Orangewood Children and Family Center), CASA, and Human Options, to name just a few.

A Year in Review

This past year has been a remarkable period of growth and achievement for JLOCC. We proudly welcomed over 20 New Members, expanding our community of dedicated women committed to making a positive impact. This growth in membership reflects our ongoing Mission to foster a community of women empowered as leaders and change-makers.

In line with our Mission to address pressing societal issues, we announced a new community impact area during our 6th Little Black Dress Initiative: Gender Equality: Empowering All Women and Girls. This impact area underscores our commitment to serving the community in significant ways, advocating for gender equality, and providing support and resources to empower women and girls.

One of our key highlights was hosting the 5th annual She Is Women's Conference in the spring, which was a resounding success. The event brought together inspiring speakers and engaged participants, creating a dynamic space for learning and empowerment.

We worked with our community partners and provided Membership with service opportunities, including a successful diaper drive which collected over 4,000 diapers for families in Orange County.

Finally, we saw substantial growth in our Training Collaborative of Junior Leagues. This innovative year-long training program, created by JLOCC, grew to 26 Junior Leagues from around the world. Together, we create impactful training opportunities centered on "Advancing Non-Profit Leadership Skills" for our 8600+ collective Members. This collaborative effort exemplifies our dedication to nurturing leadership and fostering a global network of empowered women driving positive change in their communities.

As we reflect on these accomplishments, we are incredibly excited about the future and the many ways we will continue to serve and uplift our community.

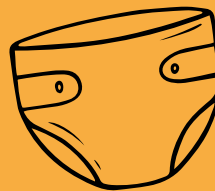

Made updates to HQ to improve the Member experience: cloud-based security system and thermostats, improved wifi range, and a library!

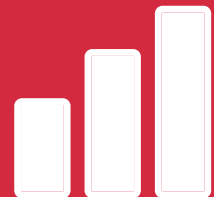
Held an Annual Business and Voting Meeting with formal parliamentary procedure.
