Junior League of Orange County, CA (JLOCC) is a volunteer organization of 300 women committed to advancing women's leadership skills to impact our community. Since its inception in 1956, JLOCC has supported Orange County by infusing hope and catalyzing change within numerous community organizations through volunteerism and advocacy.



JLOCC is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that has contributed over \$7.5 million and countless volunteer hours toward the establishment, and in support of, many Orange County organizations for nearly 70 years. Some of the most prominent and effective institutions in Orange County were started by JLOCC, including the Newport Bureau of Volunteerism (OneOC), New Directions for Women, Orangewood Children's Home (Orangewood Children and Family Center), CASA, and Human Options, to name just a few.

A Year in Review

The 2024-2025 League year was one of progress, innovation, and renewed momentum. Guided by our Mission to advance women's leadership for meaningful community impact, Junior League of Orange County, California (JLOCC) continued to build upon a legacy of service, training, and collaboration that has shaped Orange County for nearly seven decades.

This year, JLOCC developed and ratified a **seven-year Strategic Vision and three-year Strategic Plan**, establishing a roadmap to guide the League's long-term growth and sustainability. A **structural assessment of Headquarters** was also completed, with planning underway for renovations that will enhance the Member experience and strengthen our home base for years to come.

Membership engagement and leadership development remained at the forefront. JLOCC hosted nine leadership development events and three thematic General Membership Meetings, welcoming 22 New Members, 12 Transfers, and 13 1956 Society Members.

We extended our impact into the community through seven Service Learning events and the **inaugural Community Celebration**, where JLOCC brought together five community partners through their shared dedication to Orange County and empowering all women and girls. Advocacy initiatives such as Bubbles & Ballots, Gavels & Governance, and the Legislative Analysis Bonanza (LAB) further empowered Members to engage in civic leadership and policy awareness.

The League also made significant strides in operations and accessibility, **launching a new external-facing website** and implementing upgrades to security, technology, and facilities at Headquarters. JLOCC continued to lead on a national level through the Training Collaborative of Junior Leagues, now connecting 86 Leagues nationwide in shared learning and leadership development.

Throughout 2024-2025, JLOCC embodied purpose, collaboration, and vision. Together, our Members, donors, and partners advanced our Mission—empowering women to lead, creating opportunities for growth, and inspiring meaningful change in our community.
